#### House of Delegates Recap - February 24-25, 2023

WHAT happens at HOD?: Local society members convene annually at the COA House of Delegates meeting to represent their society membership and to conduct association business. Each society gets a certain number of delegates based on the size of the society (we got 6 delegates this year!). Delegates hear updated reports from various COA committees and other organizations closely associated with the COA. More importantly, delegates vote on changes in leadership and on any bylaw or policy resolution proposals to enhance the governance of the COA.

WHERE: Grand Hyatt Hotel - San Francisco, CA

TAKEAWAY: We gained an extra delegate spot this year due to growth in our society! There were no proposed policy resolutions or bylaw amendments to vote on this year. All COA board positions also ran unopposed. So although there was no voting this year, attending is generally our opportunity to give voice and impact change within the COA. They were overall very receptive to our concerns, with the most positive response to the budget neutral SB 1089 which would open up lab choices for Medi-Cal eyeglasses outside of PIA. 


