

The Legislature adjourned its 2015-2016 Legislative Session on Friday. One important issue remains that will benefit optometry patients and we need your help:



Assembly Bill 1831, which would require health plans to refill eye drops early, has passed the Legislature and awaits signature by Governor Jerry Brown. This important measure is authored by Assembly Member Evan Low and is cosponsored by optometry and ophthalmology.
