

# **House Of Delegates**

House of Delegates - February 9-10, 2024

WHAT happens at HOD?: Local society members convene annually at the COA House of Delegates meeting to represent their society membership and to conduct association business. Each society gets a certain number of delegates based on the size of the society (we got 5 delegates this year!). Delegates listen to updated reports from various COA committees and other organizations closely associated with the COA. More importantly, delegates vote on changes in leadership and on any bylaw or policy resolution proposals to enhance the governance of the COA.

**TAKEAWAY**: There were no proposed policy resolutions or bylaw amendments to vote on this year. Four candidates ran for 3 open COA Trustee positions. Our own CCOS member, Dr. Chris Fisher, was re-elected! It was enlightening to see what goes on within the inner workings of the COA and all the hard work they do to support our profession. # **Legislative Day Recap**

Legislative Day Recap - February 26, 2024

WHAT is Leg Day?: Society members visit the Capitol to take meetings with local lawmakers to make our voices heard to ensure that laws and regulations are in place to protect the public's eye health and our optometric rights.


**WHERE:** Cafeteria 15L and the Capitol Building - Sacramento, CA

TAKEAWAY: It was a busy day at the Capitol with the COA and many other organizations taking meetings with lawmakers all day. We had 4 society members represent the Central Valley this year. Our team met with 5 lawmakers and/or their aides. The main focus of this year's Leg Day was to ask for support for Medi-Cal reimbursement rate increase. The governor's proposed budget would increase reimbursement rates for optometry to match what Medicare pays currently. Right now, Medi-Cal pays only 25% of what Medicare pays and that rate hasn't increased in over two decades! The money to pay for the increase wouldn't come from the general fund, but would come from a managed care tax that is already in place. If approved, this would hopefully allow for more optometrists to afford to accept Medi-Cal patients and could be a game changer. On the next page is the handout we left behind after our meetings. Being a part of legislative day was a great way to see first hand the importance of the COA in our legislative efforts to protect our profession!

### Medi-Cal reimbursement rates

Please support the governor's proposed budget that would increase Medi-Cal reimbursement rates for optometry services. The current reimbursement rate for an eye exam for a new patient is just 25% of what Medicare pays and has not been increased in over 20 years. Meanwhile, optometrists are paying higher costs in every part of their business. As much as they want to, many optometrists can't continue to accept Medi-Cal patients when reimbursement is far below the cost of providing care.

### Timely access to quality eyeglasses

Please support SB 340 (Eggman), which would allow optometrists to get Medi-Cal eyeglasses from the Prison Industry Authority (PIA), or a private lab. Current Department of Health Care Services policy requires that eyeglasses for the Medi-Cal program be obtained through the PIA. Unfortunately, the delivery system is fraught with long delays and quality control issues. Medi-Cal beneficiaries often wait 1-2 months to receive their eyeglasses and thousands are suffering because they cannot see well enough to perform necessary life functions. With two-thirds of Medi-Cal patients people of color, the lack of timely access to eyeglasses in Medi-Cal is an equity concern.

### **Expanding access to eye care (scope of practice)**

Please support increasing access to eye care by expanding the services that doctors of optometry can provide patients. Today's optometrists are trained to do much more than they are permitted in California. Optometrists in other states are performing minimally invasive procedures, including the use of lasers to treat glaucoma and removing small skin tabs and cysts from around the eye, with no increase in adverse events. As our population ages, more patients need these services, especially in rural and medically underserved areas. Allowing optometrists to practice to the fullest extent of their training allows the 2,000 ophthalmologists in California to focus on more complex surgical care.


