COMMUNICATIONS MESSAGE

Hello doctors,

I love seeing patients everyday. I love my job and I'm sure you all do as well. I don't know if it's just because I'm getting older, but some days I just get really cranky (the better description would start with a B) and I just want to go home and never see another patient again. Does anyone else ever get this feeling?

I've been looking for other avenues where I can still be an optometrist without seeing patients. Last week, I started working on my first opinion report as an expert witness for the State Board of California. It was a great way to make some extra income and keep me interested in optometry. It is also a great way to contribute to maintaining the standard quality of care.

As an expert witness, you can accept or decline cases as you see fit. Each case starts at \$1000 or \$100 per hour for 10 hours. More complicated cases would of course compensate more. A lawyer informed me that you could make \$300-\$500 per hour working for private lawyers as you gain more experience.



Other ways you can contribute to the profession include mentoring prospective optometrists and providing training for externships for 4th year students in optometry school. Providing an externship location can also be a good way to recruit more doctors to the central valley. There are also 2 philanthropy events in September and November that you can volunteer for. Alert - Extortion Scam Targeting DEA Registrants - June 11, 2019

Extortion Scam Targeting DEA Registrants



DEA is aware that registrants are receiving telephone calls and emails by criminals identifying themselves as DEA employees or other law enforcement personnel. In an attempt to create the illusion that these criminals are DEA employees, they have masked their telephone number on caller id with a phone number for a legitimate DEA office. For example, these criminals have used the phone numbers for DEA's Office of Congressional and Public Affairs and DEA's 800 number which is used to provide direct support to DEA registrants.

Impersonating a federal agent is a violation of federal law. Registrants should be aware that no

DEA agent will ever contact members of the public by telephone to demand money or any other form of payment or threaten to suspend a registrant's DEA registration.

If you are contacted by a person purporting to work for DEA and seeking money or threatening to suspend your DEA registration, submit the information through "Extortion Scam Online Reporting" posted on the DEA Diversion Control Division's website, www.DEADiversion.usdoj.gov.

From the California State Board of Optometry – Immunizations by Optometrists

There has been a great deal of interest in the implementation of Assembly Bill 443 (Salas, Chapter 549, Statutes of 2017), which would allow a TPA-Certified Optometrist to administer immunizations if the optometrist meets certain requirements and applies for certification from the Board.

At present, the Board is not accepting applications, course completion certificates or payments for the immunization certification.

Immunization applications and payments sent to the Board will not be processed and will be returned to the licensee. The Board is not allowed to accept these until regulation implementing AB 443 becomes law (anticipated Spring of 2020).

The procedure for the immunization certification is currently undergoing the regulatory rulemaking process. The Board approved text (describing the certification procedure) and a draft application form at the April 5, 2019 meeting, but this was the first step in the process and not the final approval. The final regulation, including the actual text and application form, will be made by the Office of Administrative Law (OAL), not the Board. Licensees who have taken or are enrolled for a course in immunizations meeting all necessary requirements are advised to maintain completion certifications for submission to the Board in Spring 2020. The proposed regulation does allow any course taken after October 1, 2018 to be retroactively accepted. However, OAL makes the final decision and may make changes to retroactive acceptance or other parts of the procedure submitted by the Board.

ONLINE VISION TESTS

Help COA Raise Awareness about the Dangers of Online Vision Tests

REPORT PATIENT EXAMPLES OF SERIOUS EYE CONDITIONS THAT WOULD HAVE BEEN MISSED BY ONLINE EYE TESTS

Several companies, such as Opternative, market online "vision tests" directly to consumers for the purpose of obtaining an eye glass or contact lens prescription. This technology allows patients to self-administer a series of visual tests and pay for an eyeglass prescription signed by an "optometrist" or "ophthalmologist."

The Federal Drug Administration issued a warning to Opternative in 2017 demanding cessation of marketing its online product. Opternative continues to operate under apparent violation of federal law.

Furthermore, Opternative has partnered with 1-800-Contacts to enable patients to obtain contact lenses without an in-person exam. This new technology promises consumers convenience and affordability but also raises concerns for patient safety.

We know this can range from missing contact lens related problems such as fitting issues or corneal damage to sight threatening problems like glaucoma or retinal detachments -- or even life-threatening diagnoses such as uncontrolled diabetes, malignant hypertension or tumors.
